All children deserve the educational support necessary to become lifelong learners and successful adults! Some children thrive in the public school setting while others require higher levels of support and a customized education. Our K-12 Therapeutic School and Day Treatment Program is fully accredited with a 4:1 student-to-staff ratio that integrates social, emotional, behavioral, and academic learning.

Admissions Criteria

Tennyson's Day Treatment Program specializes in working with children who need extra support at school, often due to the influence of past trauma or other emotional and behavioral needs. We currently work with children who struggle with emotional regulation and need additional emotional support to be successful in school.*

Referral Process for Educators

In order for a student to be eligible for Day Treatment services (including ASPEN), the student must have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) that lists the student's Least Restrictive Environment (LRE) as a separate school. **Due to these requirements, we are not able to take referrals directly from a student's caregiver.** However, we can accept referrals from other professionals as long as the school district has approved the placement.

If you have a student that the school district has identified as needing a separate school setting and you would like to refer them to Tennyson's Day Treatment Program (including the ASPEN program), please complete the following steps. Any questions should be directed to our Admissions Department at admissions@tennysoncenter.org.

1. Complete Tennyson's referral document at tennysoncenter.org/admissions;
2. Email a completed referral form along with a current IEP to admissions@tennysoncenter.org. Please note that the student's IEP must have a separate school listed as their LRE setting in order to qualify;
3. Please include any other documentation that may be helpful for us in determining whether we are the best placement to meet the student's needs. This may include additional testing, clinical assessments, or reports.
