Our Residential Program supports children ages 6-16 who qualify for the Children's Habilitation Residential Program (CHRP). Licensed by the Colorado Department of Human Services (CDHS) as a Residential Child Care Facility (RCCF), the program also meets Health First Colorado's Home and Community-Based Services standards.

The program supports children with intellectual or developmental disabilities (IDD) and co-occurring mental health diagnoses whose needs cannot be met in less intensive settings. Tennyson's trauma-informed care includes individual and family therapy, group sessions, and expressive therapies like music and art. Children benefit from a structured, home-like environment while learning life skills, emotional regulation, and healthy relationship-building.

Our team uses evidence-based practices such as TCI, ARC, DBT, and CBT to build resilience and protective factors. Daily programming includes social-emotional learning, recreation, and independent living skill development. Children also participate in age-appropriate community outings, such as trips to parks, museums, and local events, which promote confidence, socialization, and real-world interactions.

The residential program provides a secure environment for children who need intensive therapeutic care and stability.

24/7 CARE AND SUPERVISION: A structured and supportive setting to help children heal and grow.

THERAPEUTIC MILIEU: A holistic approach integrating therapy, education, and recreational activities.

FAMILY REUNIFICATION: Focused efforts to strengthen family connections and prepare for a transition home.
